

The Difference We Have Made: Achievements 2017 – 2019

Worked to elect the Council candidates we endorsed.

Result: In 2017 the mayoral candidate and all four council candidates that we endorsed were elected.

 Advocated for changes to the Ephesus-Fordham (Blue Hill) building code.

Result: Council adopted new regulations requiring redevelopment projects in the district to include a minimum amount of commercial space. Town Council will consider limiting building size this fall.

- Pressed for transparency in County governance.
 Result: Through a request under the NC Public
 Records Act, we obtained important light rail budget
 information from GoTriangle and shared it with
 Orange County elected officials from whom it had
 been withheld.
- Petitioned the Town Council to fix the Town's tree ordinance to stop wholesale tree clearing.

 Result: Council referred petition to staff for ordinance changes and Mayor initiated a tree planting program to restore the canopy.
- Supported local food producers by helping the Chapel Hill Farmers' Market advocate for a new home on property the Town owns on Legion Road.

Result: Gained more public support for a permanent home for the market that can be utilized as a gathering place for many community activities.

 Fought for better stormwater controls in areas that regularly flood such as Ephesus-Fordham (Blue Hill).

Result: Town Council allocated funds toward flood storage project downstream of Eastgate Crossing.

 Worked for town policies that will slow the loss of affordable rentals and advocated for town support for displaced residents.

Result: Council started fund to help displaced Park Apartments residents and invested in a pilot rent subsidy program at Glen Lennox. Supported Rogers Road Community and surrounding neighborhoods to develop mixed income housing in buildable portions of the Greene Tract.

 Advocated for solar energy systems on Town Buildings.

Result: All new Town-owned construction will be in accordance with American Institute of Architects 2030 energy performance goals, which will probably require rooftop solar energy systems.

 Petitioned Town Council to develop a Townwide traffic modeling capability.

Result: Council voted to allocate resources to build a town-wide traffic model.

 Advocated higher standards for health and the environment before deciding on a solution for the in-town coal ash dump.

Result: Staff and Town Council hired a risk assessor to quantify the risk before the Council decides what to do.

 Supported local residents' efforts to inform Town and County governments about how proposed land use changes would affect their neighborhoods.

Result: The proposed projects were either withdrawn or modified in ways that reduced their impact on established neighborhoods.

• Hosted Speaker Series on local topics of interest and kept public up-to-date on current news and information with a monthly newsletter.

Result: A better informed community.
